

## Upcoming Microsoft 365 Training: OneDrive, OneNote & Whiteboard!






### Event Recap: Microsoft Teams April Training Sessions

#### CanSSOC Threat Feed Pilot Service Webinar: Tues. May 12



The Canadian Shared Security Operations Centre (CanSSOC) is hosting a webinar on **Tuesday May 12 from 1:00 p.m. – 2:00 p.m. EDT** to launch its Threat Feed pilot service.

The threat feed collaboration platform provides a sector-specific threat intelligence (TI) repository with specialized feeds for current and educational-specific threats. As a pilot service, members will receive blacklist and whitelist internet protocol (IP) feeds for sites to deploy directly into protection solutions. CanSSOC analysts will aggregate and curate essential TI data and members will be able to easily share their own TI back to the platform.
