Highlights from McMaster's Cybersecurity Awareness Campaign

As part of [National Cybersecurity Awareness Month](#), McMaster's IT Security Team shared tips and tricks to help Marauders stay safe online. Throughout the month of October, the team published articles on various cybersecurity topics, from [credentials](#) to [data storage](#). This campaign will conclude on October 31st with a Halloween-themed escape room, designed to help participants understand how to identify and avoid phishing scams. Campus-Wide Upgrade to Windows 10

As many of you are aware, Microsoft will no longer be supporting Windows 7 with regular updates as of January 14, 2020. To ensure critical updates are provided on a regular basis, computers across the campus must be upgraded to Windows 10. More information will be provided to IT services across campus to assist with communicating this change and delivering this important update.

Campus-Wide Wireless Enhancement

Following the [wireless enhancements](#) to MUSC, Thode and Mills, McMaster IT is launching a [two-year initiative to enhance Wi-Fi across 51 campus buildings](#). Beginning in November 2019, a project team will be communicating with IT and building partners to ensure students, staff, and faculty are aware of these

changes. With endorsement from IT governance, this project has a project charter and steering committee in place to guide the installation of new wireless access points across campus. Please stay tuned for more information as we work with you, our IT community, to share this exciting initiative with the broader McMaster community.
